<p>formerly</p> <p><b>Definition:</b> Refers to a past state or earlier time. Something that is no longer the case.</p> <p><b>Example:</b> I recently met her husband, who was formerly a school headmaster.</p>	<p>miniature</p> <p><b>Definition:</b> Very small.</p> <p><b>Example:</b> My friend's son is a miniature version of her.</p>
<p>view</p> <p><b>Definition:</b> An opinion or way of thinking about something. Also, something that is seen.</p> <p><b>Example:</b> My view on capital punishment is that it is wrong.</p>
